


2025 Community Impact Data



Key Findings

- ✓ The areas impacting residents most align with our established task groups.
- ✓ There was an upward trend in mental health calls and emergency visits.
- ✓ Older adult fall accidents saw a linear upward trend.
- ✓ Overdose deaths decreased by 56.6% in 2025. There was also a significant decrease in accidental drug toxicity fatalities.




2025 Emergency Department Encounters


Task Group-Specific Data Trends

Additional Context for Data


The data presented from Northwestern University includes information from across the state of Illinois is limited to only 2023. This is due to a lag in data collection.

The opioid overdose data from Will County was collected in conjunction with HERO.




Fall & Lift Assists 2019-2025
