### CRIME REPORTING

## PATROL

### *Calls for Service:*

The New Lenox Police Department handled 2,513 calls for service for the month of February. A call for service, simply put, is any sort of activity police personnel perform which is logged through Laraway Public Safety Communication Center (dispatch). Incidents in this category are representative of events either dispatched or officer initiated. Calls for service include criminal, non-criminal and administrative activity.
